This has been our third appearance in this festival and from the way the week went, it was another successful display of Japanese culture for a country to experience. As none of us have been to Poland before, we were wide eyed by the sights, and sounds of Poznan, the language, the currency, the architecture all had us pointing and clicking our cameras while walking the streets from

Mönchengladbach and another round of workshops in the studio on the first floor. A big thanks to BIS Zentrum for again assisting in arranging our workshops, concerts, and accommodations.

A week later and we found ourselves in Holland, and another day of workshops at the dojo of Circle Percussion. This was exciting for us as it was the first time we had met the members of Circle Percussion. They have a long history of performing in Holland, having recently celebrated their 40th anniversary. It was a pleasure to host the workshop in their dojo and we look

Myself, coming from a partly Polish background, I was excited to sample some authentic pierogies, (stuffed dumplings) though there were a number of different meats, fish, salads, soups and breads to please the palate.
