We celebrated New Years with what has become somewhat of a tradition with Tokara, our annual New Year performances in the Hirugami Onsen area of Achi village. For those of you that have not attended our week long workshops series, the INADANI Taiko Drumming Course, or Tokara Wadaiko Bootcamp, this area is where the participants stay while attending the above mentioned

And that energy has already been put to good use. The second half of our Kazakoshi World Tour is about to begin. This half of the two year tour will be celebrating the 10th Anniversary of Wadaiko Tokara. The group was officially created on March 7th, 2004. Ten years may seem like a long time, but when you are in the middle of a group that is constantly in pursuit of improving itself, that time can seem like a blink of an eye.

So it will most likely be no surprise that along with our tour we have organised another tour along with Ensemble Liberta titled: <u>Haruka naru Hibiki</u>. For those of you unfamiliar with this group, you will be in for a real surprise. Ensemble Liberta is a wonderfully melodic cast of musicians, blending the sounds of koto, shakuhachi, double bass, keyboard and percussion. Their







sound is as dynamic as their style, ranging from traditional Japanese to Latin and contemporary. It will be a joy to tour with them again.

Our tour will begins again in Canada, in the city of Kelowna BC with two concerts, a workshop and school performances in the surrounding area. From there, it is back to Japan with another full schedule of concerts and workshops including the INADANI Taiko Drumming Course and Tokara Wadaiko Bootcamp as well as our annual Saiwai Shimoina Wadaiko Festival. Our special guests this year include Hanyui (Kodo - Sado Island), Feniks Taiko (Belgium) and Wadaiko STAGE CREW GINYUDAJIN (Iida City, Nagano). As you can see, the Iineup for the super show is packed with excitement. So if you find yourself in the area, this is one festival you will not want to miss. Finally, we will be returning to Europe in the fall, where we will finish out the rest of the tour. Details on the Europe portion of the tour are forthcoming, so stay tuned.

Last but not least, Wadaiko Tokara has created a special photo booklet to support our Free for Schools Project. In order to raise the funds, we have put together a book of the best photos of our tour from last year. All proceeds from sales of the booklet are to be put towards funding to offer free performances to schools who do not have the necessary arts budget for cultural activities.
